Bruce Campbell MacGunnigle has been a member of the Rhode Island Society for over 40 years. He is a descendant of Brewster, Chilton, Cooke, Fuller, Hopkins, Rogers and Warren.

Governor MacGunnigle has held more General Society offices than any other member, including Captain General and Assistant Governor General. He has also served as Congress Planning Committee chair at four General Society Congresses and authored the Fuller Five generation genealogy book. A 50th Year Anniversary for One Family

Membership of the New Hampshire Mayflower Society began a period of growth with the Election on October 15, 1963, of Dallas Wylie Prugh. Her Certificate No. 27,569 and NH State No 291 was granted on ancestor, Richard Warren, followed by a second line through Warren and a line through Edward Doty. Dallas was quickly installed as the NHMS Historian for the term of 1963-1965 with Col. William H. Bassett, Jr. presiding as Governor. Dallas held the Historian position through 1965-1967 and 1967-1969, and during this period she processed thirty applications in 1964, that included five family members, forty-three applications in 1965 with six more family members. By Election Dates, the family members include:

July 9, 1964: four children were Elected: No.307 Richard W. Prugh; No. 308 Beverly P.

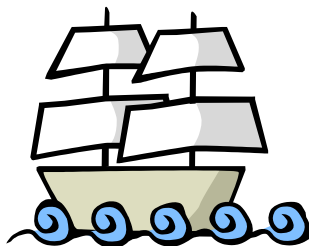
If so, you know how much nicer it is in color, right? It also saves the society on production and postage costs.
